HNR 351, and HNR 378 thesis courses by end of summer 2021 term.

A sample of student work will be assessed.

Review of thesis proposal document, which is assessed by the Faculty Senate Honors Committee at least a year before thesis project completion; if needed, additional confirmation through review of completed thesis project, to

see how closely the final outcome aligned with initial planning. Theses that are intentionally designed to be uni-disciplinary may be segregated out. We anticipate 15-20 samples will be assessed.

Due to the pandemic, the Honors Committee did create options for students to adjust their thesis project when impacted by Covid limitations. Proposals with severe adjustments – ie. students who needed extensive travel or field data – will be excluded from the assessment sample.
