NON-DEGREE SEEKING STUDENT APPLICATION: INSTRUCTIONS AND PROCEDURES

A **non-degree seeking** student is a person who is qualified to enroll for classes at Western Oregon University (WOU), but is not seeking to earn a degree or other university credential for which formal admission to the university is required. The non-degree seeking status is specifically designed for the person who desires to take a very limited number of courses for purposes other than obtaining a degree or certificate at WOU.

Individuals in any of the following circumstances are not eligible to be admitted as a non-degree seeking student:

- 1. Individuals suspended because of academic deficiency, or that are not in good standing at any prior institution.
- 2. WOU students pursuing an undergraduate or graduate credential that will not earn the credential prior to enrolling as a non-degree seeking student.
- 3. Individuals denied admission that are seeking to earn a credential without complying with university admission requirements and procedures.

A non-degree seeking student is required to abide by all the policies, regulations, codes of conduct, and rules of the university. Limitations placed upon a non-degree seeking student are:

- Non-degree seeking students are limited to eight (8) undergraduate or graduate credits each term for fall, winter, and spring. The summer term limit is sixteen (16) or fewer undergraduate credits or twelve (12) or fewer graduate credits.
- 2. Non-degree seeking status is valid for four (4) terms for undergraduate classes, or two (2) terms for graduate classes. Students must apply for readmission once the allowed time is exhausted.
- Only individuals that have earned a baccalaureate degree are potentially eligible to enroll as a non-degree seeking student for purposes of taking graduate classes.
- 4. Individuals with or without a baccalaureate degree may be eligible to enroll in undergraduate classes.
- WOU will not evaluate or hold records in preparation for earning a university credential. These academic services are limited to fully-admitted, degree-seeking students only.

WOU will maintain an academic history of courses completed in accordance with university policy and practice. Such credits have the same transferability and validity as credits earned by admitted students. Credits earned by a non-degree seeking student subsequently may be accepted into a formal program upon later admission to the university. A maximum number of forty (40) credits of WOU non-degree undergraduate coursework can be applied toward an undergraduate degree program. A maximum number of fifteen (15) credits of WOU non-degree graduate coursework can be applied to an endorsement, specialization, certificate, or graduate degree program.

Note: Students interested in pursuing a degree program or other university credential must apply for formal admission to the university.
