There is a need for trained professionals to work in numerous fields related to gerontology, elder care services, and geriatric medicine. Oregon and the nation's population are undergoing a dramatic increase in the percentage of older adults.

According to data compiled by the Administration on Aging, by the year 2030 there will be approximately 70 million Americans aged 65 and over, up from 40 million in 2010. The U.S. Census Bureau estimated that Oregon's older adult population is increasing at a rate of 3.5% as compared to the national median of 2.6%.

In addition to the growing older population that will require specialized services, there are also unmet work force training needs. According to the U.S. Department of Labor, employment in home health care services are expected to increase 69.5% between 2004 and 2014, during the same time period, community care services for older adults are expected to see a 54.8% increase in the need for qualified employees. People from a broad range of career fields who have received training in gerontology will be marketable and provide important services for our community.

An integral component of the gerontology program is a practicum option, which allows students to get real-world experience through two required practicum courses. As recent gerontology alumni have attested, the practicum experience helps students navigate the transition from college to the workforce.

### Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can I major in psychology and minor in gerontology?

Yes, students can major in psychology and minor in gerontology; however, if a class is used for the minor (e.g., GERO 320), it can't also be used for the major.

2. Will GERO 320 (Introduction to Gerontology) be offered every year and does it have any prerequisites?

Yes, GERO 320 will be offered at least once every year and the only prerequisite is PSY 201.

3. Is a practicum required for this minor?

No, a practicum is not required but it is encouraged (GERO 410W, Gerontology practicum I) as it is a great way to get real-world job experience and make connections in the field.

4. Are there any prerequisites for courses in the gerontology minor?

Yes, there are prerequisite courses for all of the psychology courses. Students are advised to take PSY 201 & PSY 202, one of which can count for the "additional social science course" needed for the Liberal Arts Core Curriculum (LACC).

5. I am a Psychology Major and a Gerontology Minor. Can I use the same course, such as PSY 483 (Adulthood & Aging) for both my major and minor?

No, students cannot "double-dip" or use the same course for your major and minor.

## Gerontology Minor

The gerontology minor should be planned with an advisor. The gerontology minor consists of 27 hours of focused courses beyond introductory prerequisite coursework.
