Discussion of degree plans and Gen Ed concerns	Kate Connolly and committee members	The committee discussed recent concerns regarding the "WOU Way 30-60-90" plan for undergraduate degrees. The issue of most relevance to the IESC committee is that the plan privileges a BS degree as a default and would make it prohibitively difficult for students wanting a BA to fit 2 years of foreign language study into their degree. The committee stands by the goals of a liberal arts education that prizes the humanistic values of diversity and cultural competence that are direct outcomes of foreign language study.
