 - 4.1. Adele Schepige, Faculty Senate President

4.2. Rex Fuller, University President

- All universities recommended tuition increases above 5% had to present to Higher Ed Coordinating Commission
 - Southern, Oregon Tech and Western approved
- Continue to work in legislature to close funding gap
- 25 WOU Volunteers at capital for "True Day"
- State revenue forecast released
 - o Increase in revenue; May invoke "kicker"
 - o If too much revenue, will have to give back
- With UO and PSU
 - Both asking for reconsideration
- Talked about "kicker," some years have been encouragement to give that back by state. Wonder whether we could encourage to get that directed towards education?
 - Option to give back
 - If people knew it would go directly toward education . . .
 - Will follow up on

4.3. Stephen Scheck, University Provost

- Transfer SOAR
 - Largest transfer SOAR in 11 years
 - Memo sent out about upcoming SOARS
 - Will be adding additional SOAR Tuesday, Aug. 29th



- Looking for faculty and staff that are flexible and willing to work with transfer students and incoming freshmen
- In Fall of academic year (2016), 42% of new students to WOU were transfer students
 - Other public universities are flat or declining
 - Relationship building faculty making between faculty on other campuses
 - Long range enrollment planning: More presence on Community College Campuses
- Bilingual teacher ed program
 - Had representatives to celebrate with DACA students who received scholarships from Mexican consulate this year
- Want to be very certain that WOU has adapted some of the standard types of program reviews
 - Program review, depending on environment, may be only self-study next year
- Question about need more of a physical presence at Chemeketa.
 - U of O and OSU had huge rack
 - o Is backyard, any plans?
 - Will have storefront personal experience there
 - Want to keep all material current
- 4.4. Erin Baumgartner and Tad Shannon, Interinstitutional Faculty Senate
 - IFS website: good place to go to get meeting minutes, is user friendly
 - Transfer Student Bill of Rights has moved to joint Ways and Means
 - IFS recommending partnership with HECC
 - Will be Fall of 2017
 - Will work with other IFS senators over summer
 - Senate Bill 207 (AP score of 3 or above)
 - Due to lobbying, formalizes HECC reviewing
 - Several Bills addressing changes to PERS
 - HECC member positions phasing out
 - Can apply through Governors website
 - o Can view timeline
 - Students from the University of Oregon and Portland State showed up, persuaded commission to turn down tuition proposals
 - Was moment where it felt like students were pitted against faculty in issue of resources
 - Even students and students pitted against each other
 - If can advocate for program quality, is key message
 - 13% cut on Pell Grants
 - Student voices will be powerful in lobbying

- 6. Consideration of Old Business
 - 6.1. Suggested Principles for Online Teaching, Eric Bruce, Online Teaching Task Force chair
 - Where would this be housed?
 - Center for Academic Innovation where all documents should be housed
 - Address student documents
 - Looking at developing video for student preparedness for taking online classes
 - Looking at Prof. Chat that is Moodle and online class focused
 - Task Force looking for endorsement from Faculty Senate
 - Move to endorse suggested principles for Online Teaching at WOU
 - Seconded
 - Motion carries, is endorsed
 - 6.2. Faculty Resolutions on the proposed WOU Way 30-60-90 framework, Humanities, and Natural Science and Mathematics divisions
 - All resolutions put together into one document
 - Been discussion amongst divisions that created these about possibility to merge into one
 - Prepared to put all three up to merge, or vote on each one separately
 - Voting to endorse? Division's right to express their feelings? Is Faculty senate going to create position?
 - o Original idea to have faculty senate to endorse these
 - If Senate votes in favor of any one of these resolutions . . .
 - Someone could present a motion to create a resolution tying all of these together
 - If want Faculty Senate Executive Committee to do something like that, would be brought back at July Meeting
 - Original idea to have faculty senate to endorse these
 - Voting on separately wouldn't make sense
 - Division of Deaf Studies looked at strategic plan to find language that supports idea that faculty are really experts on content including what needs to be in Gen. Ed. Requirements
 - Difficult to make a decision without seeing them all together
 - o Are we able to delay making this decision today?
 - Would like to explore possibility of having one statement from body that comes from all of us
 - Social Science Resolution
 - Opening paragraph, clause beginning with "and no confidence in" happy to strike
 - Objections about fifth paragraph, about Role of general education committee—happy to remove whole fifth paragraph
 - o Final paragraph is key paragraph; refers to current process
 - Implication is that is not fully done deal and is a starting point for conversation; indicates this is an ongoing process
 - Second paragraph acknowledges Provost's apology



- Might be people sitting here who may not want to craft a document at all
 - Room for two motions today
 - Accept Steve Scheck's apology of process
 - Gen. Ed task force can address 30-60-90 in a different way
 - Want to make sure have way to have input as faculty on these decisions
 - Flexibility
- Could have alternative motion
 - Been a motion and second not currently voted on
 - Rejecting resolutions as is
- Accept Steve Scheck's apology and his promise that gene d task force would be able to suggest changes other than proposed 30-60-90 structure
 - o Reject resolutions as written
 - Motion does not pass
 - Also requests to have something in writing, currently all that is in writing is WOU way
 - Can drop in lieu that administration has heard us
 - Movement and second
 - Is important to move on, but people have something wanting to say and get on the record
 - Not a bad thing to put something on record
- Divisions putting forward resolutions could get together and come up with joint document
- Motion to approve humanities resolution
 - Happy to explain any vague language
 - No discussion when was new business
 - Seconded
 - Would not preclude bringing a larger, more comprehensive statement to this table now or any time in future
 - General statement about collaboration (Humanities)
 - Final paragraph of social science could be pinned to that
 - Could put final paragraph of NS and Math as more specific example; all forward looking
- Multiple divisions have produced statements about concerns
 - These resolutions are way of stating concerns
- Clarification: fully propose amendments
 - Humanities general statement
 - Followed by broader statement about General Ed Task force (final paragraph, Social Science resolution)
 - Specific statement about General Ed Task Force (More specifically, <u>after completing their work</u>) (Natural Science and Math resolution, final paragraph)
- Move to approve amended resolution
 - Seconded
 - o Is new document, haven't had chance to bring back to divisions
 - 15 approved, 6 opposed; motion carries



7. Consideration of New Business

- 7.1. General Education Committee draft General Education Mission and Learning Outcomes, Shaun Huston, General Education Committee
 - Crafted mission statement and learning outcomes
 - Started process in fall
 - Gathered feedback
 - Circulated drafts of documents
 - At most recent meeting came up with final drafts
 - Anticipation is that task force will use whatever statement gets endorsed
 - Philosophy and Humanities have suggested changes
 - If any suggested revisions for this between now and July meeting . . .
 - Task force itself would have latitude to revise these
 - Want to emphasize gen ed committee did not create this
 - Is distillation of faculty feedback
 - Doesn't mean there can't be refinements or revisions
 - Already been vetting process for statement currently presenting
- 8. Informational Presentations and Committee Reports
 - 8.1. Spanish Language Program, Jaime Marroquin, Kathleen Connolly, Patricia Giménez-Eguibar
 - Relates to whole Gen ed changes
 - Problem with department of modern languages
 - Notified by provost
 - o German and French degrees have very low enrollment numbers
 - Had meeting with Provost to address these issues
 - Suggested to create general degree for modern languages
 - BA for modern languages/German/French
 - Come to decision that would like to keep BA in Spanish as independent degree
 - Don't see any evidence that this will actually solve enrollment problem
 - Don't feel like Spanish really fits with French and German
 - Were some questions about whether Spanish major good for employment
 - o 5% increase in salary if certified bilingual speaker
 - o Being bilingual is plus
 - Think that should keep BA in Spanish
 - Want to have ongoing discussion with others in department
 - o Having at least one year of languages as part of Gen ed. is must
 - Move to extend meeting to 17:05
 - Motion carries
 - 8.2. Assessment Facilitation Steering Committee report, Carol Harding, Assessment Facilitation Steering Committee chair
 - Met once a quarter.
 - Tried to maintain forward motion
 - More of advisory body
 - Items under No. 5 are things that have not been done but have taken certain steps to advise or facilitated
