3. General Education requirements are built around learning outcomes and content criteria

- Transfer substitution requests or other exceptions are not about Prefixes or sequences, but about alignment to GELOs and criteria.
- Students need to have reasonably met requirements, no matter how many credits they have.
- Transfer degrees are one way that students meet requirements - we want to review transfer or other Associate degrees that aren't recognized in Degree Tracks!

4. Petition requests require evidence that a requirement has reasonably been met.

- Students do need a rationale and evidence
 - There may be something related to their degree plan or a previously approved LACC exception.
- Plan to provide a course description for substitutions.
- General Education office reviews and implements petitions.
- Review will be delayed if sufficient information is not available.
