We are pleased to announce that the WOU Textbook Affordability Initiative Steering Committee will provide a second round of funding for the OER Stipend Program this fall. Awards will range from \$1000-\$4000 for instructors to adopt, adapt, or create OER resources for their course(s). The goal is to significantly reduce course materials and textbook costs for students, yet provide access to high-quality, pedagogically creative, open educational content for teaching, learning, and research. Both tenure track and non-tenure track faculty are invited to apply for this competitive grant, which is administered by the Textbook Affordability Committee, Hamersly Library and Academic Innovation.

- 4. WOU responses since the last Faculty Senate meeting on July 14th
 - WOU delayed the final Article 15 report due date from Aug 15 to late October, in order to have more faculty input
