




- Outreach and education on COVID-19 safety and contact tracing information at the Salem Dream Center (West Salem)
- Assistance with screenings and procedures for students and guests moving into WOU residence halls
- Development of health communication materials for WOU students to prevent the spread of COVID-19
- Support for mental health and wellbeing for farm workers and their families by providing monthly healthy living toolkits which includes a healthy living newsletter and resources for children and their caregivers

- Production of a COVID-19 informational video presentation for the WOU Division of Education and Leadership Initial Licensure Programs







Vaccine Update:

Three companies conducting promising late-stage clinical trials (AstraZeneca, Moderna, and Pfizer) have released detailed blueprints with information on how trial participants were selected and monitored, what reactions would prompt the trials to be stopped early, and evidence required to determine whether people who got the vaccine were protected from the coronavirus. They do not expect initial analyses of trial data to be conducted until November.

Good News (International):

A netball team from the <u>University of Sussex</u> ran the length of the United Kingdom - over 1,400 km- to raise money for the National Health Service. Each team member ran 44km and took part in the challenge all over the UK. So far they have raised £4,555 (\$5,837).
