I am honored to be considered for the WOU Interim Presidency. In reviewing my application materials I think you will find that I have the requisite education and experience to perform the duties of interim president, and I have done this before at two Oregon universities (EOU and OIT). I have also worked at WOU, albeit briefly in 2018, and I was very impressed with the quality of your Board members, faculty, staff and students and their commitment to the university. Student success, academic excellence, community engagement, accountability and sustainability and stewardship are easy tenants to support.

Briefly, I feel the following activities deserve our attention in the coming months:

- Rebuilding enrollment with an eye toward becoming a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI);
- Regaining our finances by maintaining a balanced budget and replenishing reserves to a prudent level;
- Continuing the growth and development of the Salem Center;
- Building on the recent efforts regarding diversity, equity and inclusion by supporting the recently created task force and other related initiatives;
- Enhancing fundraising and continuing to work on the capital campaign;
- Rebuilding our research portfolio, if feasible;
- Attracting and retaining a diverse faculty and staff;
