- 80-90% of CyberSecurity attacks are still coming in via email, so please be very cautious opening links or attachments in emails.
- Red flags should always be raised when money is involved and short timelines.
- Remember to complete the Information Security Training (in Portal). UCS
 can provide any director with a listing of their staff and their completion
 percentages.
- WOU's most recent Cybersecurity incident highlighted a real need to audit
 the network drives (H, I, J) for unneeded files that contain personally
 identifiable information (PII) or other sensitive information. Please delete
 unneeded files, and secure the files needing to be kept by encrypting them
 or moving them to DocStar.
