Honors classes can be taken out of sequence – and often are.• In select years, CA 104H (Creativity) is offered as an option to CA 103H• Science majors do NOT take the Honors science courses but instead complete the science classes in their majors• College of Education students can use the Honors science classes in their COE tracks• AP History credits do count towards one of the two required Geography classes – if you received 8 or 12 AP credits

- Honors Electives are non-core Honors classes with prefixes below 399. The topics vary year to year.
- Students generally take H303 in fall term of their junior year; accommodations can be made for students studying abroad.
- Honors seminars have prefixes of 399 or higher. Past topics have included Environmental Writing, Oregon Women's Suffrage, Prison Writing, and Peace.
- H403 is an independent study course providing credits for your thesis. You take it whenever it's convenient during senior year.
