Honors Curriculum

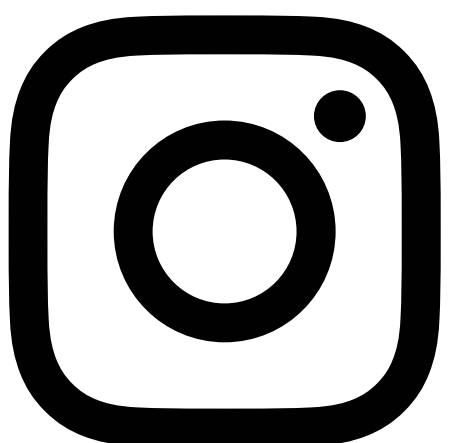
Honors students and faculty worked closely together when redesigning the honors curriculum, which is structured into three categories:
