Department / Job Summary:

This is a regular, 12-month, full-time, unclassified position in Abby's House Center for Equity and Gender Justice at Western Oregon University in Monmouth. Abby's House provides the Western Oregon University (WOU) community with educational programming, information, and referral services designed to promote equity and non-violence.

The Violence Prevention Coordinator (VPC) plans, implements, and evaluates violence prevention programming, including bystander intervention trainings and campaigns for students at WOU. The VPC is also a key member of the Sexual Misconduct Prevention Education Council (a group of staff from multiple departments across campus who all have some part to play in violence prevention) and co-manager of the Abby's House student Violence Prevention Advocacy Team.

We are not considering candidates who require Visa sponsorship support. Additionally, the university typically only considers visa support for employees placed in specialized positions that are continuing regular university appointments.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree
- Minimum of two (2) years related professional experience in an educational or social service setting or combination of settings
- Work experience and/or training on dynamics of gender-based violence and bystander intervention
- Excellent organizational, communication, and coalition building skills
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively with individuals from diverse backgrounds
- Ability to manage multiple tasks with competing timelines and frequent interruptions
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with employees at all levels throughout the institution

Preferred Qualifications:

- Master's degree
- Minimum one (1) year of experience providing supervision to student or professional employees
- Professional experience creating and conducting program assessments
- Work experience/training in direct service advocacy
