The Department of Theatre and Dance at Western Oregon University (WOU) invites applications for a Visiting Assistant Professor in Acting/Performance/Voice/Movement. This limited term, two-year position (with possibility to re-apply) has a full-time teaching load (15 credits per term). The successful candidate will teach acting, movement, and voice in WOU's Bachelor of Fine Arts Acting Program; teach general education classes such as Introduction to Theatre and Elements of Acting (for non-majors); possibly teach courses in a secondary specialty such as musical theatre, period styles, contemporary audition, and/or improvisational, applied, or devised theatre. Additionally, the person will direct one main stage, studio, or parlor show annually, which will represent a portion of the total teaching load. We are committed to ensuring that visiting faculty can continue to fulfill a creative research agenda with practice in public theatre performance.
