The Information Systems program at Western Oregon University invites applications to fill a full-time tenure track position at the assistant or associate professor level starting in Fall of 2020.

This position provides an opportunity for a new faculty hire to shape the direction of the Information Systems program as it refines its graduate program and expands its undergraduate offerings to serve a contemporary need. Areas of interest include information management, enterprise systems, systems architecture, continuous development, decision making, data science, business analytics, network science, simulation of social and economic systems, and cybersecurity.
