# **RE:** [WOU-Notice] Faculty preparation for Coronavirus (COVID-19)

#### Dear Colleagues,

Teaching faculty are encouraged to be prepared to deliver content, accept assignments and evaluate progress toward meeting course goals in the event that campus is closed because of Coronavirus (COVID-19). For Spring 2020, we encourage you to prepare at least 2-3 weeks of course content that could be delivered remotely (e.g., Moodle, email or other means), even if your course is scheduled to be taught face-to-face or as a hybrid. This will ensure the continuity of our courses, our academic programming and student progress toward degree completion. In order to be prepared for a possible campus closure, I strongly encourage all faculty to activate each of your Spring 2020 courses within Moodle and upload at least a syllabus, so the site is ready to build out further, if needed. Every course with a CRN has a Moodle shell. If you need instructions on how to make your Moodle site visible, please consult this tutorial (look under "Quick Start")
