Status check explanations:

- 1. Expecting contributions This means that the person shows as a current member of PERS (Tier 1, Tier 2 or OPSRP). They have worked for one or multiple state agencies for 6 months and 600 hours to meet eligibility for membership.
- 2. **Not expecting contributions** This means that the person is a PERS retiree. They were a member of PERS either Tier 1, Tier 2, or OPSRP and retired from a PERS employer and are currently or did receive retirement from PERS.
- 3. Not expecting contributions; currently serving wait time This is the trickiest status. This means they "currently work" for one or multiple PERS participating employers and are "currently" working toward meeting eligibility for membership. They have not had a break of service of more than 30 days since they began working.

 NOTE: This status can be misleading, due to employer records not being updated correctly with one or more PERS employers. In the event a person has this status we should contact PERS Employer Services to determine if the person is truly "currently working" for a PERS participating employer and has hours reported in this calendar year (or across the calendar year if applicable).
- 4. **Not Expecting contributions; must serve a new wait time** This means that the person may have worked for a PERS employer in the past, but did not meet PERS Membership and does not currently have any reported hours in the current calendar year.
- 5. **No Record** This one is pretty straightforward. Their SSN does not show up in the PERS system. They do not show as ever working for a PERS participating employer.
