About Western Oregon University:

Western is one of Oregon's oldest public institutions of higher education and was incorporated into the state system as a teacher training institution in 1882. The university offers undergraduate and graduate degrees in arts and sciences, education, and professional areas. It's known for small class sizes, a focus on sustainability and a diverse liberal arts education in a student-centered environment. Western is an emerging Hispanic Serving institution, with 37% of undergraduates being students of color.

Position Summary:

The Lead Interpreter reports to the Deaf, DeafBlind, Hard of Hearing Accommodations Coordinator and functions as a professional interpreter—to facilitate communication with the Deaf, Hard of Hearing, DeafBlind and hearing faculty, and their interactions in the classroom with students, and/or meetings with faculty, staff, and for campus/community relations. The Lead Interpreter provides a communication link between professors and other faculty, staff, and students for classes, meetings, or social functions as needed. The interpreter will work between spoken English and American Sign Language (or ProTactile, when applicable). The Lead Interpreter must be flexible according to scheduling and be responsive to the Deaf, DeafBlind, Hard of Hearing Accommodations Coordinator, meaning that there is occasion for last-minute requests or on-call interpreting when necessary. Environments may include (but are not limited to) lecture/didactic situations; casual and formal interactions with faculty (signing and non-signing, staff, students and community members and stakeholders. Hours vary, while there is an effort to create a set schedule of available hours from term to term, and there are occasional weekend assignments.
