Position Summary:

The Assistant Director of Scholarships will focus on the coordination of the WOU scholarship and award programs (Foundation and fee remission awards) along with state grants and scholarships and private third party scholarships. This position is responsible for managing key aspects of the online scholarship management software, steering the General Scholarship committee, assigning scholarship awards based on the scholarship committee member's rankings and preparing award letters for those students. The AD of Scholarships is responsible for overseeing the proper awarding and reconciliation of approximately \$6.5 million in private and institutional funds annually. The Assistant Director of Scholarships must have both broad and detailed knowledge of the policies and procedures for administering federal and state financial aid, in accordance with federal, state, and institutional regulations and policies. The AD of Scholarships may be called upon to perform duties typically assigned to a Financial Aid Counselor during times of peak financial aid file processing to ensure timely delivery of aid to students.
