About Western Oregon University:

Western Oregon University is a regional public, mid-sized university – committed to changing lives, strengthening communities and transforming our world. Located in Monmouth, the heart of Oregon’s lush Willamette Valley, WOU is about 20 minutes from Salem, the state’s capital and about 75 minutes from Portland, the state’s cultural hub.

Western is one of Oregon’s oldest public institutions of higher education and was incorporated into the state system as a teacher training institution in 1882. The university offers undergraduate and graduate degrees in arts and sciences, education and professional areas. It’s known for small class sizes, a focus on sustainability and a diverse liberal arts education in a student-centered environment. Western is an emerging Hispanic Serving institution, with 41% of undergraduates being students of color.

Position Summary:

Western Oregon University invites applications for a full-time tenure track Assistant Professor position in our multi-discipline Organizational Leadership Master’s Program housed in the Division of Behavioral Sciences. We are seeking applicants with a background in Organizational Leadership or Industrial Organizational Psychology (with an emphasis in leadership) to contribute to the growth of our Organizational Leadership Master’s Program and three certificate programs: An Adaptive Leadership Certificate, an Enabling Leadership Certificate, and an Executive Leadership Certificate. Faculty may also teach related Industrial Organizational core undergraduate courses in the Psychological Sciences Department.

The successful applicant would contribute to the growth of the Master’s program and may have an opportunity to provide leadership as the Program Coordinator. The position duties would entail teaching in the Organizational Leadership Master’s program (possible classes include Fundamentals of Leadership, Building Effective Teams, Leadership Action Project, and seminars/courses in the applicant’s specialty area), teaching occasional undergraduate Industrial Organizational Psychology core classes (e.g., Psychology of Teamwork, Introduction to Industrial/Organizational Psychology, Psychology of Leadership, Occupational Safety and Health), advising Master’s level students, sitting on student exit project committees, growing the program through community outreach, and other administrative and recruiting tasks.

Furthermore, the position requires engaging in ongoing scholarly activity and service to the program, university, and profession. Applicants who are able to develop courses in which organizational leadership is applied to other areas such as Executive Coaching, Leadership and Work-Family Balance/Building Healthy Organizations, Leading Across Cultures, and Leading Sustainability, and are encouraged to apply.

Minimum Requirements:

- PhD in Organizational Leadership, Industrial Organizational Psychology, or a related field/area of expertise focused on organization development and change (ABD considered if the degree is completed prior to the start date)

Preferred Qualifications:

- Teaching experience in higher education at the graduate and/or undergraduate level
- Evidence of productive scholarship

- Understanding of a broad range of organizational leadership topics such as building teams, organizational behavior, executive coaching, leadership and work-family balance/building healthy organizations, leading across cultures, and leading sustainability
- Experience in program development and growth
- Experience in program leadership and coordination
- Experience building relationships with community partners and recruiting strategies
