ACCESS (AKA ODS)

- What does the Office of Disability Services do?
- Federal laws provide framework for ODS include the Americans with Disabilities Act, the ADAA and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973



ACCESS, HOW WE COMPARE

Some universities approach for student fee funded areas:

The individual IFC funded area would be responsible for funding any accommodations needs. This approach can lead to individuals feeling like a burden to provide accommodations,, which can lead to a less inclusive approach.

WOU approach

- Access is allocated funding to address accommodation needs for all areas who receive IFC funding. This approach can lead to a more inclusive experience for those requesting accommodations.



ACCESS

- Funding required to ensure IFC funded areas are accessible to people with disabilities
- Access (ODS) provides accommodations, upon request
- IFC funding usage:
 - Any funds not used for accommodations in the are returned to the IFC reserve
 - Unexpected increase in accommodations requests beyond the projected amount, will need to be funded by the IFC reserve

No cut package provided

- Required to provide the accommodations
- Can be reduced if IFC decides to do so, but if expenses for accommodations go beyond the amount allocated IFC will need to use reserves
