### This year, we have served a total of 38 children

- 11 children have parents attending WOU
- 9 children have parents that are WOU employees
- 18 children have parents who come from the community
- We employ 17 WOU students part-time, most are from the College of Education.











## Operation during COVID-19 (we hope to return to normal operations for the 22-23 year)

- ➤ We were approved to operate 3 rooms of Preschool. We elected to keep our 2 large rooms at 15 students in each room instead of 20.
- > Each classroom is a stable group, with the same teachers.
- Extensive sanitation and safety procedures have been put in place.
- We were not able to open our Toddler or Elementary age programs due to high costs.



# IFC FY 22-23 Academic Year Funding Request

We are requesting our service level funding, the same as the 2021-2022 year:

**>>** \$53,113

- > Cut @ 10%= \$47,802
- > Cut @ 20%= \$42,490
- > Cut @ 30%= \$37,179
- This will not include a summer program at this time.





# IFC FY 22-23 Academic Year Funding Request (We hope to be back to our full enrollment of 50 little students by Fall 2022)

- > Fall 2020 IFC served 11 WOU students at the CDC at 45% subsidy = \$9,046
- Winter 2021 IFC served 13 WOU students at the CDC at 45% subsidy = \$11,353 (we used carry over from Fall term 2020)
- Spring 2021 IFC served 13 WOU students at the CDC at 45% subsidy = \$10,712
- > Fall 2021 IFC served 10 WOU students at the CDC at 50% subsidy = \$6,213. (any funds remaining will be returned to IFC)



### IFC dollars at work

- The IFC tuition subsidy helps to recruit non-traditional students with children to attend WOU
- > 100% of IFC Funds go directly to subsidize the WOU students' childcare tuition. (Currently 40-50%)
- Both the WOU Student and their child are receiving a high quality education
- WOU CDC provides on-campus part-time employment for College of Education students
- CDC helps encourage retention of WOU students by supporting parents with affordable childcare which removes a common barrier to completing their education
