Hi Steve,

Yes! While we do not have a private video hosting solution, we *have* regained access to YouTube and other non-core Google Apps at WOU this fall (you can read more on Bill Kernan's blog: <http://www.wou.edu/wp/underthehood/2014/09/11/google-licensing/>) and we encourage you to take advantage of it.

To get started:

Login to WOU Gmail and then navigate to youtube.com to sign in for the first time with your WOU account. You may need to set up your profile and/or channel information but the process is fairly brief. Once you've entered your information, you can add videos! Click "Upload" in the top corner of any YouTube page when signed in. This will let you drag-and-drop to upload a video file. You can choose from the following publishing options when you do so:

1. Public
2. Unlisted (your video will not appear in search results and only users with the direct link can view it)
3. Private (you can identify users who can view your video by name--be sure to use their [@mail.wou.edu](mailto:mail.wou.edu) account)
