

Want to learn more about the Chinese culture & language?

Are you interested in better serving our International students?

If so, consider this professional development opportunity that could be of great value to the students you serve. The Division of Continuing Education and Outreach Services will be offering Beginning Chinese Language and Culture during Winter Term. The 10-week class will be held on campus, Thursdays from 5 to 7 p.m.

This is a beginning conversational Mandarin Chinese course, focusing on pronunciation, basic conversation, situational dialogue, and an introduction to the Chinese culture. No prior Chinese language experience is necessary and there is no required text to purchase!

Choose one of three registration options:

- 1. Take the class for no credit and pay just \$135 (cost includes course materials)
- 2. Take the class for 2 undergraduate credits (Hum 199) and pay \$235 (includes materials)
- 3. Take the class as professional development, approved and paid by the University. Reduced cost available of \$120 for first person, \$100 for each additional participant from the same department (includes materials).
