 - Answer- there is real promise that this will work. Part of this is coming from the pressure to follow the house bill law that was passed several years ago.Previously there did not seem to be anything being pushed forward until student leaders expressed their frustration with the lack of DEI support.



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- UDIAC has been ready to move forward with work but there has not been the funds to do so. Everyone on the committee has full time jobs and cannot support this work without paid positions dedicated to this work.
- Question- When would the groups working on campus to promote DEI work come together?
 - This would happen when funding is approved. Once the funding is approved then the committee can see how many paid positions can be created. This would be the office that can oversee the different groups and help everyone work together.

 - Administrative Equity
 - Meeting Set for May 26th from 2-3:30pm
 - Shared Governance
 - April 22nd- President of Staff Senate, Faculty Senate, and ASWOU Senate as well as the WOU President
 - May 14th will be the Shared Governance Summit
 - Questions will be collected ahead of time for each of the presentationsan announcement was sent out at the end of last week with details
 - The Faculty Senate is going to be voting down Article 15 at their next meeting and are going to be voting on the language of S/NC grading and when that would be used.
 - ASWOU elections have happened and will be starting at the beginning of June
 - WOU is working with the vaccine clinic to get word out to staff, students, and



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community members. Right now there are walk-ins on Mondays and Fridays.

- The concern was expressed to Dr. Fuller that staff has not been involved in much of the talk about returning to campus. He recommended reaching out to Judy V.
- Jenna has created a spreadsheet that will be detailing what staff senate is currently working on. This would be available to any member in the Google Drive.
- CARES funding was discussed regarding how that could be distributed towards the BIPOC community. There are rules regarding the funding and how it can be distributed to students, so it cannot be specifically given to BIPOC students.
- The interim president announcement was not made at the board of trustees meeting. There was an email the next day announcing that Board Member Jaime would be taking over as the chair of the search committee.
- 2.1% increase in tuition was recommended and approved by the Board of Trustees

University Council

- Much of the discussion was rehashing the board meeting.
- ACES lab presentation regarding how WOU is performing in terms of "Learner Success" the first findings showed that WOU is doing average. There are committees that will be working to do some more research to find out interventions that can be implemented to continue improving in these areas.
- There are several house bills going through the house that pertain to higher education. Some of the most notable ones regarding funding and allowing the TRU Universities to have doctoral programs.
- UTAC present on upgrading 10 classrooms to become smart classrooms from CARES money. All classes will be moving to Canvas. There is a push to move more classes to a hybrid model in the future.
- Next board meeting will be June 9th.
