Dear Incidental Fee Committee,

I am writing to you today regarding Campus Recreation's climbing wall maintenance enhancement request. This money will allow climbing specialists to maintain quality and safety at the climbing wall. This enhancement for wall maintenance is a wise use of student dollars for a number of reasons - here are a few.

The climbing wall is a big draw for prospective, new and current students. At the new student week event this fall, literally hundreds of people lined up to get to experience the climbing wall, and the rush continued, unabated, for over two hours. The reason that this was possible was because of the number and variety of high-quality climbing routes available.

The Health and Wellness Center is the last stop on the campus tour for a reason - the building's appearance and what is has to offer is attractive to new students. When visitors first enter the building, the climbing wall is one of the impressive parts of the building and is what visitors see when the enter and exit the building. A blank or uninspiring wall is something that will not help out the recruitment of new students (and their future IFC dollars!).

Safety! Maintenance allows not only for quality routes to be set, but for staff to identify and correct safety issues ranging from loose and spinning holds to worn hardware and ropes.

The PE class that runs every term and is incredibly popular (waitlisting by mid-registration week) depends on high-quality routes and their variety. Students should be able to have a rewarding introductory climbing experience.

Finally and most importantly, I ask you to consider where else on campus students must volunteer *just to do their jobs*. Wall maintenance is not optional, or an extra frill. It is a mandatory part of the job. Do we ask library workers to volunteer to re-shelve books? Valsetz workers to wash dishes for free? No, and we shouldn't have to. If someone serves food at Valsetz and is paid, they should also be paid to complete the job and get the dishes in the dishwasher. It is a sound and smart use of student dollars to pay students to make a place for students better.

Hello IFC members,

I would like to put my voice in for this coming decision regarding the 2015-2016 school year. My name is Chas Esping and I am a third year transfer here at WOU. I work here on campus at the HWC as a supervisor. I started there as just a Lifeguard and have moved through each position. I am qualified and work almost every job available through Campus Recreation including the Rock Wall, Fitness Instructor, and Aqua Exercise/Swim Lesson instructor.

I would like to give my opinions about the decision that will be made soon. I unfortunately cannot make it in to the meetings because I work in Salem every evening.

First, I really believe that creating a full time position for a Business Officer will substantially help the Health and Wellness Center. As a supervisor I am asked to train new staff, open the gym, set up fitness classes, and other everyday duties. When we are training new staff it takes away time from other tasks that we as supervisors need to perform for the gym to run smoothly. When trying to run the gym and train new staff there are holes that we cannot cover while training them on the 80 different topics that they needs to know. With a full time Business Officer our jobs as Supervisors will not be as stressful while trying to train a new staff member, set up two fitness classes, deal with upset patrons, and supervise the staff that is on shift all at the same time.

Second, the Climbing Wall is a growing asset to the Health and Wellness Center. Throughout my three years going to school here and working as a Climbing Specialist I have seen the climbing community grow immensely. I remember when I first started here the climbing community was very small, and it only included most of the climbing staff. Now when I am working on the wall I notice there are more community members using the wall as well as more students. The climbing wall needs to have some upkeep and maintenance regularly. If this is not done climbing route tape starts falling off walls, holds become dirty, and routes become monotonous. When the holds get dirty they are covered in climbing chalk, skin cells rubbed off of hands, dirt or gross things that come off shoes. These things need to be cleaned. I know for a fact that some of the Climbing Specialists have come in and volunteered their own time to come in and do these things. This is a necessity for us to do on the wall and as a Climbing Specialist I believe we should be getting paid for our work.

I have been reading through the requests from the Clubs, Athletics, Student Media, ASWOU, Creative Arts, Wolf Ride, Childcare, WUC, SLA, and SAB and there are things I really believe that student dollars should be funding and others that should not.

Throughout the Clubs section I noticed errors in spelling, grammar and professionalism. I feel that if Clubs are asking for money, the person writing them should be professional and spell correctly. I urge you to go back through the requests and find these errors and either correct them or not grant them their request.

Athletics is a whole realm of issues. First, about 5.5% of the whole student body here at WOU are student athletes. For them to receive some of these funds they are requesting is a disservice to the other 95% of the student body. There are things that I believe that the students should fund including travel funds, meet entry

fees, funds to pay for officials, new uniforms (to a certain extent), and some equipment.

Football is a big sport and there is a lot of people who like to see Western's team play well. I believe that we (as students) should NOT have to pay for a new Coach Comm System. \$40,000 dollars is an absurd amount and I would not like to see my fees going towards purchasing a new communication system that will not benefit ANY student on campus other than the coaches communicating as well as the players on the field or sideline.

Laptops are needed in almost every sport. According to the Football and Athletic Administration request they have computers that are six to ten years old. They cannot run their programs to view film because of the age of the computers. I personally have a computer that is six years old and since I have updated the operating system I have had no problems running programs or any problems with my computer running slow. I do not see a need in providing new computers that can work perfectly fine. On the other hand, Baseball and Basketball may actually need new computers. According to the request the Baseball team is sharing one laptop for all work related duties. Basketball has requested a new computer to replace a broken one. I have a couple of personal friends on the team as well as the Coaching staff. According to them, they were having to use a coach's personal laptop to watch film and in the process it broke. Now they are having to use players' laptops to watch film. These two teams I believe may benefit from a new computer.

There are also four personnel positions that Athletics is requesting. A Women's Soccer assistant coach should not be paid for by students. Why would our fees support a new assistant coach when only a handful of students benefit from this. I could see the benefit for the other three positions requested. Having a Strength and Conditioning Assistant Coach would help relieve duties from the Head Coach as well as benefit with credit weight training classes. A physician available would be a great idea for those athletes who may be injured or recovering from an injury as well as pre-season physicals. Student interns that would travel from OSU is a great opportunity because it gives a new opportunity for those interns from OSU as well as the athletes that are in training.

There are a couple of things that cause a major safety concern. The Hammer/Discus area and the Baseball practice pitching mounds have caused or could cause major injuries. These need to be taken care of first I believe because of the safety for our athletes as well as the public near the throwing area.

Now I know that there are items that are a necessity but there are many things that are not needed or help the general student population. There are in fact some funds that have been requested that should be granted that a majority of students here at WOU would notice. This includes Wolf Ride getting an ADA accessible van, childcare, WUC replacing items, SLA and their activities for students, and SAB activities. These funds requested should be looked at more in depth to see how it will affect the general population of students that use these things.

I would very much appreciate my voice being heard at the meetings because I cannot attend them because of work.



I would like to say thank you for our current funding level. I have been a student-athlete at this university for four years and I am truly thankful for the opportunities that I have been able to earn in my time here. I say earn, because contrary to the beliefs of some, the student-athletes here at WOU are not handed anything. As a senior in cross country, this was the first season that I was provided a full uniform, a racing singlet, and a pair of bottoms. All my other competitive I have only receive a top, and had to purchase my own bottoms as well as shoes to race in. I have also seen the impact of decreased funding in my program as the amount of athletes that get to travel to competitions have continued to be cut, limiting our chances to be successful and represent the university. And representing the university is what we do, when we put our jersey's on it's not to show off, it's to show the thousands of people all of the country, what we stand for at Western Oregon University. As student-athletes here at Western Oregon, we all work our hardest just for the chance to compete, and even then many of us are not allowed the opportunity to. The current service level funding that the Athletic department is asking for need not to be seen as hand-outs, and over the top request, honestly the funds we are asking for are just to allow the department to be able to function at a reasonable level.

By decreasing the Athletic operating budgets by five percent, Western Oregon University will be choosing to limit more opportunities of students. The Incidental Fee funds are supposed to be dispersed in a fashion that provides benefits for the most students possible. But what would happen if the rest of the departments that were asking for any enhancements also got cut five percent? Spanish club, student media, theatre arts, ASWOU, all receive funding from IFC and are allowed to provide opportunities for students on campus, but they wouldn't be functioning without funds from the IFC. The same goes for the Athletic Department.

As mentioned above, in my time here at Western I have seen continual decreases in the opportunities that the student-athletes can earn. Currently, because of our limited budget, student-athletes are denied the chance to represent WOU and compete to better their talent. If our department was to receive a five percent cut, these travel and competitive opportunities would see an even more significant cut. Student-athletes would then have to bus to competition in states as far as way as Montana and Idaho, this would impact the student-athletes overall academic performance by increasing travel time and missed classes.

As students of this university we understand how expensive it is to go to college. However, the requests to fund our current service level for the Athletic Department would just allow the department to afford to keep operating. These request for current service level funding are not frivolous, without them the athletic department will be losing ground on what allows us to stay successful.

I have talked with numerous students on campus about this cut and these students are supportive of a fee increase. Attached is a list of students who support the above statements.
