RE: Final Recommendations for FY2020

The Cabinet has concluded its deliberations regarding the Phase 2 proposals. As a group, we benefited greatly from the joint UBAC/Cabinet presentations. The shared dialog provided key insights to our work. As we discussed at this meeting, our recommendations are subject to final budget deliberations for FY20 by the Board of Trustees.

As you may know, the Board of Trustees voted unanimously to raise resident UG tuition by 2.33% (i.e., \$4 per credit). This decision is based, in part, on a recommendation from the Tuition and Fee Advisory Committee (TFAC), which recommended an increase of no more than 2.5% in resident UG tuition. With tuition set, we are now building the budget with an assumption of flat enrollment and no less than \$40.5M in Public University Support Fund (PUSF) funding from the Legislature as per the Ways & Means Co-Chairs budget. WOU continues to work with the other public universities to reach a PUSF increase of \$120M. If the final PUSF budget increase remains \$40.5M, WOU will have a deficit budget for FY20 and we will use reserves to balance the budget at year-end.

In these challenging times in higher education, Western must continue to make strategic investments to grow enrollment, improve retention and graduation, and ensure affordability. For these reasons, the Cabinet identified about \$650,000 in investments.
